278.400, stating that the May 6, 2020 Order failed to address the requests of Inter-County, Nolin, and Shelby to revise their pass-through mechanisms to pass-through environmental surcharge amounts billed by EKPC for Rate B, C, G, and special contract customers directly on to those customers before the surcharge pass-through factor is determined. 2.
