Getting Through the Winter Heating Season

Natural gas utilities offer budget payment plans that allow customers to pay the same amount each month based on average monthly usage. On this plan, customers know how much is expected each month for payment of their heating bills. Each utility has its own enrollment periods and eligibility requirements, so call your local gas company as soon as possible to find out what options are available to you.

Start saving now. Finding money at the end of the month is sometimes im-



ossible. If you are able, set aside a little extra now to use when the heating bills hit. Settle

any outstanding balances you may have for last winter's heating costs.

Winterize your home.

Winterization Tips:

Consider installing a programmable
thermostat that automatically lowers
the temperature when you're gone and
raises the temperature when you are
home. Or you can adjust your existing
thermostat to lower

the temperature setting before you go out.

- Make sure your furnace, furnace filters and ducts are clean. A clean furnace is much more energy efficient than a dirty furnace.
- Insulate your water heater and the first six feet of the hot water supply line.
- Seal out cold air. Insulation gaskets can be purchased for electrical switches and outlet plates at local hardware stores.

 Open blinds and drapes during the day to let the sun heat the room.
Close them at night to prevent heat loss.



 Adjust the temperature on your natural gas water heater. Keep the temperature on the warm setting (120 degrees).
