ORDER

IS IS ORDERED That Auxier Water Company shall file an original and twelve (12) copies of the following information with the Commission (with a copy to the Attorney General's Consumer Intervention Division) by August 18, 1980:

- 1. A copy of the water bills from the City of Prestonsburg for the period May 1, 1979 through July 30, 1980.
- A breakdown of salaries by employee along with their specific duties performed. Also submit the duties and time spent on the job for the manager.
- 3. A copy of the insurance bills or estimates quoted by the insurance company for the amount of increased coverage.
- 4. A copy of the agreement or contract for professional services and fees.
- 5. A copy of the tax bills along with an explanation of the increase in taxes. If necessary show calculations.
- 6. A copy of the utility bills and justification for the increase in each utility bill.
- 7. A breakdown of the operating supplies account.
- 8. A breakdown by account and amount for customer accounts expense.
- 9. A complete description of the \$20,000 for the extensions of new lines including the method of financing, total cost of construction, date construction will begin, date construction will be completed and the number of customers to be added.

The above requests relate to the Comparative Income Statement for the test period May 1, 1979 to April 30, 1980.

Tariff Filing of Tapp Communications Company To Establish Additional Charge for Radiotelephone Calls in Excess of Three (3) Minutes

On June 19, 1980, Tapp Communications Company filed with the Utility Regulatory Commission a tariff sheet whereby it proposes to establish an additional charge for radiotelephone service of twenty-five cents (25¢) per minute or fraction thereof for time in excess of three (3) minutes per call. The Commission having considered the tariff filing and being otherwise sufficiently advised, FINDS:

 Radiotelephone service is designed for short, concise communications and the standard limitation for such calls is three
(3) minutes.

2. The Order in Case No. 7263 established a monthly rate for an unlimited number of three-minute calls. Charges for time in excess of three minutes were not considered at that time.

3. The proposed charge is to be imposed only when a call exceeds the allowable time limit, and the taking of further evidence would serve no purpose. Formal hearing should, therefore, be waived.

4. The proposed charge is fair, just and reasonable and should be approved.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED that formal hearing be and it is hereby waived.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the proposed tariff filing, as described herein, be and it is hereby approved, effective on and after the date of this Order. The page of the tariff filing herein approved is First Revised Page 15.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that all other rates and charges not specifically referred to herein shall remain the same.
