## ORDER

On June 5, 1980, Louisville 2-Way Radio Service, Inc. (Applicant), and Radiopaging & Radiotelephone, Inc. (Paging) filed with the Commission a joint Application for authority to transfer the Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity held by Paging to Applicant. Applicant further requested authority to assume the business operations of Paging, all as more specifically outlined in the Application and record.

This matter was set for public hearing on June 25, 1980, at 1:30 p.m., Eastern Daylight Time, in the Commission's offices at Frankfort, Kentucky. The hearing was held as scheduled and all parties of interest were given the opportunity to be heard. There were no intervenors present at the hearing.

The Commission, after consideration of this matter, including the public hearing and all evidence of record, and being advised, is of the opinion and finds that:

- 1) Paging currently provides service under a Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity granted by Order of the Public Service Commission in Case No. 5840, dated July 16, 1973;
- 2) The transfer of the above-named Certificate of Applicant is beneficial to the public convenience and necessity since accounting and administrative cost-savings will be realized by consolidation;
- 3) The proposed transfer will not result in a decrease in service nor an increase in rates to the customers of either Applicant or Paging;
- 4) Paging's Certificate should be transferred to Applicant, and Applicant should be allowed to assume the business operations and services offered by Paging.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED that the Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity held by Radiopaging & Radiotelephone, Inc., be and it hereby is transferred to Louisville 2-Way Radio Service, Inc.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that within thirty (30) days of the date of this Order, Louisville 2-Way Radio Service, Inc., shall file with the Commission its tariffs, in the manner prescribed by the Commission, reflecting the transfer approved herein.
