## ORDER

IT IS ORDERED that Louisville Gas and Electric Company shall file an original and 12 copies of the following information with the Commission, with a copy to all parties of record, by December 27, 1982. If neither the requested information nor a motion for an extension of time is filed by the stated date, the case will be dismissed. Include with each response the name of the witness who will be available to respond to questions concerning the information requested.

1. What burn rate was used to calculate the 118 day supply referred to in the response to the Commission's Order dated November 19, 1982, item 4(e.g. actual burn for the month, average burn for the year, maximum burn during the peak period, etc.). Please, provide a copy of the workpapers showing how the 118 day supply figure was calculated, including the calculation of the burn rate used.

2. Please, provide a copy of all working papers showing how the average days' supply of coal on hand for the test year and each of the five years preceding the test year were calculated provided in the response to the Commission's Data Request dated September 16, 1982, item 26c.

3. When determining an optimum coal inventory range, are other factors considered besides those mentioned in response to the Commission's Order dated November 19, 1982, item 4? If so, provide a complete list of all factors considered in setting an optimum coal inventory range. Provide the names and titles of LG&E's management personnel who make the decision as to what is the optimum coal inventory range.

4. Provide the monthly ending inventory level in both tons and dollars for the test year and each of the five calendar years proceeding the test year.
