O R D E R

On December 1, 1982, South Central Bell Telephone Company made a tariff filing with the Commission, wherein it proposed to freeze Centrex rates effective from January 1, 1983, until January 1, 1986. The Centrex Rate Stabilization Plan ("Plan") is a subscriber option to exempt the customer from increases on tariffed monthly rates for selected Centrex features.

To subscribe to the Plan, the customer must agree to pay a minimum monthly charge equal to 75 percent of the stabilized rates for the intercommunication portion of the main station lines. If the customer terminates his or her Centrex service, a lump sum payment equal to the minimum monthly charge for the remainder of the 3-year Plan will be due. However, if the customer elects to convert to ESSX-1 service for the remainder of the time of the Plan, the lump sum payment will not be required.
