IT IS ORDERED that General Telephone Company of Kentucky ("General") shall file an original and seven copies (except as otherwise indicated) of the following information with a copy to all parties of record by April 3, 1985. Each response shall indicate the individual responsible therefor.

- 1. Provide the total 1984 actual access service revenue in detail, using the format previously used in response to Item 3 of the October 11, 1984, information request.
- 2. Provide the total 1984 actual revenue from lease of facilities to AT&T Communications.
- 3. Provide the 1985 intrastate interlata revenue requirement and an explanation of the methodology used to determine that figure, including the rate of return utilized.
- 4. Provide the total 1985 projection of revenue from lease of facilities to AT&T Communications, including a statement of the rate of return utilized.

- 5. Provide the total 1985 estimated access service revenue in detail, using the format previously used in response to Item 3 of the October 11, 1984, information request, including a statement of the rate of return utilized.
- 6. Provide the studies submitted to AT&T during November, 1984, as referenced by Mr. Sporleder's letter of October 25, 1984, to Mr. Skaggs.
- 7. Provide a detailed example of how the lease price for a given facility leased to AT&T Communications in Kentucky is determined.
- 8. Provide three <u>complete</u> copies of Article 1 and Article 5, including any and all exhibits or appendices, of General's agreement with AT&T. (Separate each Article, Exhibit or Appendix.)
