O R D E R

IT IS ORDERED that Cincinnati Bell Telephone Company ("Cincinnati Bell") shall file an original and 15 copies of the following information with the Commission, with a copy to all parties of record, by October 28, 1985. Each copy of the data requested should be placed in a bound volume with each item tabbed. When a number of sheets is required for an item, each sheet should be appropriately indexed; for example, Item 1(a), Sheet 2 of 6. Careful attention should be given to copied material to insure that it is legible. Moreover, Cincinnati Bell shall furnish the name of the witness who will be available at the public hearing for responding to questions concerning each area of information requested herein. When information requested herein has been provided along with the original application, in the format requested herein, reference may be made to the specific location of said information in responding to this information request. If neither the requested information nor a motion for an extension of time is filed by the stated date, the case may be dismissed.

1. Provide all cost studies completed by Cincinnati Bell on optional local measured service in Kentucky with a description of each study.
2. Provide all cost-benefit studies prepared by Cincinnati Bell related to implementing local measured service in Kentucky.
3. Provide all demand studies used to estimate price elasticity for on-peak demand, off-peak demand, and demand for access lines in Kentucky.
4. Provide all studies used in determining that low use LMS is an effective and efficient lifeline rate structure.
5. Provide test year revenue impact (by class of service) if the Commission should impose a moratorium on expansion of optional LMS in this rate case. Include billing determinants in the response.
6. Provide copies of all demand studies used to project residential and business penetration for local measured service between 1985 and 1990.
7. Provide workpapers demonstrating that the proposed low-use and standard measured service rates for both residential and business are based on cost.
