O R D E R

Pursuant to motions filed by USA Mobile Communications, Inc., ("USA Mobile") on December 2, 1987, and December 10, 1987, the Public Service Commission of Kentucky hereby amends its Order of November 13, 1987. This amended Order supersedes the Commission's Order of November 13, 1987. This Order imposes no new obligations on USA Mobile, but does not eliminate filing obligations that may exist under the prior Order. Underlined words and phrases in this Order reflect additions to the Commission's Order of November 13, 1987.

On October 12, 1987, Johnny L. Wills, d/b/a Kentucky Radio Service, Inc., ("KRS") and USA Mobile filed a joint application requesting approval of the transfer of radio common carrier assets of KRS to USA Mobile. Based on the evidence of record and being advised the Commission is of the opinion and hereby finds that:

1. KRS is a Kentucky corporation providing tone and tone and voice paging service in Whitley, Laurel, Knox, Bell, Pulaski and Harlan counties, Kentucky. KRS also provides mobile radio telephone service in Whitley, Laurel, Knox, Bell and Harlan counties, Kentucky.

2. USA Mobile is a West Virginia corporation and operates as a radio common carrier in Matewan, West Virginia, providing the same services to its West Virginia customers as KRS provides to its Kentucky customers.

3. USA Mobile is ready, willing and able to continue providing adequate service to consumers within the service areas of KRS.

4. USA Mobile should be authorized to provide radio common carrier service to those areas formerly served by KRS.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED that:

1. The sale and transfer of radio common carrier assets of KRS to USA Mobile be and it hereby is approved.

2. USA Mobile shall be authorized to offer those services formerly provided by KRS pursuant to authority granted by this Commission.

3. Within 5 days subsequent to the transfer, KRS and USA Mobile shall file with the Commission a joint notice setting forth the date of transfer.

4. Within 30 days of the date of this Order, USA Mobile shall file a notice of adoption of KRS' tariff.

5. KRS shall have the responsibility of filing with the Commission an annual report for that portion of 1987 in which it operated the system.

6. USA Mobile shall have the responsibility of filing with the Commission an annual report for that portion of 1987 in which it operates the system.
