O R D E R

On September 9, 1987, AT&T Communications of the South Central States, Inc., filed a tariff with the Commission proposing two new services, AT&T Pro Kentucky and Reach Out Kentucky. The tariff also proposes that certain optional calling plans be made obsolete.

On September 29, 1987, the Commission suspended the tariff for 5 months from the proposed effective date of October 9, 1987. This will allow for further investigation and possible hearing to determine the reasonableness of the proposed tariff.

On October 20, 1987, the Attorney General of the Commonwealth of Kentucky, by and through his Utility and Rate Intervention Division, moved to intervene in this case. The Commission granted the motion on October 27, 1987.

The Commission, being advised, is of the opinion and finds that information requests should be due by December 2, 1987, and the Company should file its responses by December 18, 1987.
