O R D E R

This matter arising upon petition of MCI Telecommunications Corporation ("MCI"), filed May 15, 1989 pursuant to 807 KAR 5:001, Section 7, for confidential protection of certain information filed with this Commission pursuant to a request by South Central Bell Telephone Company ("SCB") to William Beard, and it appearing to this Commission as follows:

SCB has served upon William Beard requests for information relating to MCI's operation. MCI has requested that Items 2, 4, 8, 12, 13, and 14 of the requests be protected from public disclosure as proprietary and confidential on the grounds that the information is "commercially and competitively sensitive" and could be used by MCI's competition to its detriment, that the information is not known outside MCI and known only to those MCI employees who require the information to perform their jobs, that the information has been disclosed to SCB pursuant to a protective agreement, and disclosure would inhibit competition while nondisclosure would promote competition. The petition, however,

does not state how disclosure will result in competitive injury to MCI. And this Commission being otherwise sufficiently advised,

IT IS ORDERED:

1. The petition by MCI for confidential protection of the information furnished in response to Item Nos. 2, 4, 8, 12, 13 and 14 of the requests by SCB to William Beard shall be held in abeyance to allow MCI to supplement its petition with a statement setting forth with specificity its reasons for believing that disclosure of the information sought to be protected will cause MCI substantial competitive injury.

2. If such statement is not filed within 10 days of the date of this Order, the petition for confidentiality shall, without further orders herein, be denied.
