## ORDER

On May 8, 1989, South Central Bell Telephone Company ("South Central Bell") filed a Motion to Strike the First Request for Production of Documents and First Set of Interrogatories served on South Central Bell by Telcor, Inc. d/b/a TMC of Louisville and LDDS of Indiana, Inc. d/b/a LDDS Communications ("Telcor") on May 1, 1989. The Commission received no response from Telcor. In support of its Motion South Central Bell states that the discovery irrelevant, unduly burdensome, and abusive. Also, a souaht is number of questions appear identical to those Telcor filed in Administrative Case No. 323.<sup>1</sup> The Commission having reviewed the Motion to Strike, the Interrogatories, and the Request for Production of Documents is of the opinion and finds that the Motion should be granted. Telcor's Interrogatories and Request Production of Documents refer to information which for is irrelevant to this proceeding or is publicly available. However, the Commission will provide Telcor an opportunity to propound

Interrogatories and Production of Documents which are narrowly tailored to the issues in this proceeding.

On May 12, 1989, Telcor filed a Motion for an Extension of Time to respond to data requests to June 14, 1989. On May 16, 1989, AmeriCall Systems of Louisville filed a Motion for Extension of Time to respond to data requests to June 6, 1989. On May 15, 1989, US Sprint filed a Motion for an Extension of Time to respond to data requests to May 29, 1989. The Commission having considered these motions, and being advised, is of the opinion and finds that all of the above-mentioned motions should be granted to and including June 14, 1989. The Commission's response to these motions necessitates altering the procedural schedule. The Commission will shortly issue a list of topics to be addressed in testimony and another procedural schedule. Until that time this proceeding is in abeyance.
