ORDER

Contel of Kentucky, Inc. ("Contel"), pursuant to KRS Chapter 278, is a local exchange telephone company under the jurisdiction of the Commission.

At the present time, some of Contel's rural customers can only subscribe to four-party service. If customers wish to have one-party service, they must pay the monthly flat rate plus a monthly mileage charge of \$1.25 per 1/4 mile.

Recently, the Commission has received numerous complaints from Contel's customers and county and other public officials regarding Contel's service. Some of the concerns of complainants were disconnections during conversation, excessive noise signals, simultaneous calls being audible on the line, unnecessary intervention by operators, and finally that they are not able to have one-party telephone service without paying the mileage charge. Some of these complainants claimed that Contel promised to upgrade its facilities in order to provide them one-party telephone service within specified time frames, but this was not done.

Contel has responded to some of these complaints either directly or through the Commission on an informal complaint basis. However, Contel's responses have not satisfied the complainants. The Commission believes that more explanatory responses should be provided to Contel's ratepayers.

The Commission is concerned about Contel's ratepayer complaints and problems and seeks a reasonable solution. The Commission is also aware of the costs associated with upgrading Contel's system. Therefore, the Commission, on its own motion, establishes this proceeding in order to fully investigate the situation.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED that within 30 days from the date of this Order Contel shall provide the following:

1. A detailed description of all of its deferred construction plans, which directly or indirectly affect the provision of one-party telephone service, since 1986. Furthermore, Contel shall thoroughly explain the reasons for the deferral of these plans.

2. A complete schedule of its current plans regarding upgrading its system in order to provide one-party telephone service to all its ratepayers and to eliminate mileage charges.

3. Responses to the concerns mentioned in complaints which have been enumerated in this Order. Copies of these complaints are attached hereto and incorporated herein as Exhibit 1.

I hesitate to write this letter because I know you have a busy schedule, but after thinking about it, if the situation was reversed and I was in your position, I would want someone to make me aware of what is going on.

About five (5) years ago I took a day off from work and with my wife came to Frankfort and spent the larger part of the day attending a hearing for Contel. I was impressed with your attentiveness with the proceeding and particularly with the intelligence of a couple of women that Contel had working for them.

I remember during that hearing Contel brough out the point that the telephone lines were vital to the national defense and you people agreed with them. I laughted with the wife on the way home and told her that if this were true, we had already lost the war.

During the hearing Contel told of improvements that would be made, how old equiptment was being and would be replaced. After five (5) years of waiting patiently for all of these improvements I find the service or the equiptment has not been improved. I am not referring to the service or repair men, I think they do a good job with what they have to work with.

I feel the people have no one to turn to for help except you.

Contel received a raise at that particular hearing. Now I find that people on this system pay more for a four (4) party line thanpeople out in the country pay for a private line in Barren County. I have lived in Covington, Warsaw and Carrolltonand have never had and trouble with the phones untill I moved to Smiths Grove.

The problem is basicly old equiptment.

I know that you don't know me so I though that I would get a page of names of other dissatisfied customers to show this problem is legitamate. As it turns out I have almost seven (7) pages. This is from a small area around Smiths Grove - I understand the situation is about the same every where except Park City - it is better there.

Please look into the situation and see if you can help us.

Dear Commissioner:

We, the enclosed petitioners, being residents, merchants and councilmen of Arlington and Bardwell, KY, located in Carlisle County, serviced by Contel Telephone Company of Kentucky, are extremely concerned about the phone service we are receiving. Complaints are similar throughout the community, the most prevalent of which are:

- 1. Instant disconnections while in conversation.
- Noise interference so excessive, communication is nil, many times resulting in a additional calls being necessary for a thorough and exact understanding between parties.
- 3. Override of conversations, or more simply, two different calls audible on the same line.
- 4. Phones out of service for several hours for no apparent reason, such as severe weather conditions or an accident involving lines, etc..
- 5. In direct long distance dialing, an operator will intervene and ask for the caller's phone number. This is not only annoying but is a very primitive and obsolete practice. This could also result in erroneous charges, due to wrong numbers knowingly being given.
- 6. Often, two or three attempts are necessary to enforce dialing.

The afore-mentioned complaints occur quite frequently and tend to be most aggravating to the individual as well as detrimental and costly to the merchants, some of which are dependent on efficient phone service, such as funeral homes, doctors and pharmacies.

I am sure you can perceive the impact these repeated disruptions could and do have! We, in no way, wish to cast a bad reflection or voice a complaint against any Contel service man; especially, Daniel Jones and Jerry Poe, the two we are most familiar with. In our opinion, they are very capable and dedicated employees. Certainly, we are not in a position to know where or how these problems originate, but do feel a rapid solution is necessary. The old cliche, "you get what you pay for" is not applicable in this instance. True, we are a small, rather remote, rural community but this should in no way alter the quality of public service we are afforded and pay for with premium rates.

It is our sincere hope that you will give this matter your undivided attention, thereby resulting in a dependable phone system for Carlisle County.

I am a permanent resident of Edmonson County, Kentucky. I am concerned about the telephone service that is available to us in our county. At the present time, the majority of our residents who have telephone service in the rural areas have four-party lines because private lines are prohibited by high cost. I feel like all residents of the county should have access to affordable private lines.

Our adjoining counties have affordable private lines. It is now time for all residents of Edmonson County to have this service at an affordable rate.

Edmonson County is in the process of trying to acquire the 911 Emergency Assistance System. Without private lines, this causes problems.

We are approaching the 21st Century; we have sent men to the moon. We are in a space age; yet, Edmonson Countians are expected to have a telephone service that is obsolete throughout much of our natioin. There are other telephone systems that have private lines at an affordable rate in rural areas; and yet most residents of Edmonson County have access only to a four-party telephone line due to the high cost of the private line.

In 1988 I wrote a letter to the Public Service Commission expressing my concern about this matter. I received a letter from Mr. William Calvert, Administrator of Public Affairs for Contel of Kentucky (the telephone company that serves Edmonson County), as a result of this letter. Mr. Calvert stated that the current plans were to convert the Brownsville central office to digital equipment early in 1991, and that the four party and mileage elimination program was also scheduled to be completed in 1991. (A copy of this letter is enclosed.) Now Mr. Calvert has told Mrs. JoAnn Wood, a resident of Edmonson County, that there are no current plans and that there never have been any plans to convert the Brownsville exchange to affordable private lines. We keep getting put-off by Contel. It is time that Contel



should make affordable private lines available throughout Edmonson County.

Contel of Kentucky is having a planning meeting April 15, according to Mr. Calvert. I would appreciate any assistance you could give Edmonson County at this meeting in obtaining affordable private lines in the near future.
