## ORDER

On June 27, 1991, Kentucky Utilities Company ("KU") filed its application requesting deviation from Commission Regulation 807 KAR 5:04, Section 12(2). In support of its application, KU stated:

- 1. In 1989, KU obtained 102 mobile home line extension agreements; of that number 74 were for extensions between 150 and 300 feet. All advances were refunded in 1990.
- 2. If deviation is granted, this will eliminate the cost of obtaining agreements and making refunds for short extensions.
- 3. Response time in providing service to the majority of mobile home customers will be improved.
- 4. There would be no revenue change or increased risk to KU.

Extensions greater than 150 feet from the nearest distribution line and up to 300 feet shall be made if the customer pays the utility a "customer advance for construction" of fifty (50) dollars in addition to any other charges required by the utility for all customers. This advance shall be refunded at the end of one (1) year if service to the mobile home continues for that length of time.

Based on the evidence of record and being otherwise sufficiently advised, the Commission hereby finds that good cause for KU's requested deviation from Commission Regulation 807 KAR 5:041, Section 12(2), has been shown.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED that KU's request for deviation from 807 KAR 5:041, Section 12(2), is granted.
