O R D E R

On July 17, 1991, Webster County Water District ("Webster County") filed a proposed water service contract to provide water service to the Pittsburgh and Midway Coal Mining company ("P&M") at the Highway 494 facility in Webster County.

The proposed contract is based on a preliminary estimate of the costs of the construction of the distribution system to be \$90,000. P&M has agreed to pay 50 percent of the actual cost to construct the water distribution system, not to exceed a total payment of \$45,000. Webster County Fiscal Court will provide \$35,000 and the remaining \$10,000 will be recovered by the connection of approximately 67 new customers.¹

Commission Regulation 807 KAR 5:066, Section 12(4), allows a utility to make extensions under different arrangements from those prescribed in the regulation provided such arrangements have been approved by the Commission. The Commission finds that the

arrangements proposed herein are in the public interest and should be approved.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED that Webster County's proposed contract with P&M is hereby approved pursuant to 807 KAR 5:066, Section 12(4).
