ORDER

On September 8, 22, and 28, 1992, Infodial, Inc. ("Infodial"), American Tele-Access, Inc. ("American"), and Phoneformation, Inc. ("Phoneformation") filed petitions, respectively, each of which requested this Commission to enter an Order directing the Local Exchange Carriers ("LECs") to assign an abbreviated N11 dialing code. Copies of Infodial's, American's, and Phoneformation's petitions are attached hereto and incorporated herein as Appendices A, B, and C, respectively.

Because Infodial's, American's and Phoneformation's petitions appear to be identical, the Commission hereby consolidates the three petitions and initiates this proceeding to further investigate the issues concerning the assignment of N11 dialing codes. The Commission, having reviewed the petitions of Infodial, American, and Phoneformation and being otherwise sufficiently advised, HEREBY ORDERS that:

1. Infodial, American, and Phoneformation shall file with the Commission, not later than 30 days from the date of this Order, a complete description of their telecommunications operations, including but not limited to the reasons why they have requested and should be assigned an abbreviated NII dialing code.

2. All telecommunications utilities, except customer-owned, coin-operated telephone utilities, with tariffs on file with this Commission shall be mailed a copy of this Order as notice and may request intervention to participate in this proceeding no later than 20 days from the date of this Order.

Pursuant to this petition, INFODIAL is petitioning this Commission to assign to INFODIAL the abbreviated dialing code 511. However, in the event that this code is not otherwise available or that the Commission chooses to allocate an alternate abbreviated N11 dialing code to INFODIAL, such an action will be acceptable to INFODIAL.

WHEREFORE, INFODIAL, Inc., hereby respectfully requests the Commission to enter an order directing all LEC's to assign to INFODIAL the abbreviated N11 dialing code 511, or such other abbreviated N11 dialing code as may be presently available.

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
