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ORDER

Pursuant to Commission Regulation 807 KAR 5:056, the Commission on December 6, 1991 established this case to review and evaluate the operation of the fuel adjustment clause ("FAC") of Louisville Gas and Electric Company ("LG&E") for the 6 months ended October 31, 1991.

As part of its review, LG&E, pursuant to Commission Order, submitted certain information concerning its compliance with Commission Regulation 807 KAR 5:056. A public hearing was held on February 13, 1992.

The Commission has previously established LG&E's base fuel cost at 13.19 mills per Kwh. A review of LG&E's monthly fuel clause filings shows that the actual fuel cost incurred for the 6-month period under review ranged from a low of 10.47 mills in

October 1991 to a high of 12.05 mills in July 1991, with a 6-month average of 11.40 mills.

The Commission, having considered the evidence of record and being otherwise sufficiently advised, finds no evidence of improper calculation or application of LG&E's FAC charge or improper fuel procurement practices.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED that the charges and credits billed by LG&E through its FAC for the period May 1, 1991 to October 31, 1991 be and they hereby are approved.
