ORDER

On February 22, 1991, the Commission initiated this proceeding to investigate the condition of sewage treatment facilities owned by Thelma Waste Control, Inc. ("Thelma"). Commission Staff had submitted Utility Inspection Reports which alleged that Thelma had failed to maintain its sewage treatment plants in accordance with accepted good engineering practice and thus had violated Commission Regulation 807 KAR 5:071.

Since the initiation of this proceeding, Thelma has attempted to replace its troubled sewage treatment plants. On March 13, 1992, it applied for a Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity to construct replacements. The construction of these plants, in the Commission's opinion, will remedy the conditions noted in the Utility Inspection Reports. Accordingly, the Commission finds that continued prosecution of this case would serve no purpose and that this matter should be closed. The Commission intends to closely monitor Thelma's activities. Should

Thelma fail to proceed with its announced plans, the Commission will initiate a new review of Thelma's sewage treatment facilities.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED that this matter is closed and shall be removed from the Commission's docket.
