ORDER

On March 6, 1992, Cincinnati Bell Long Distance, Inc. ("CBLD") filed a proposed tariff to offer Perk Plus and Traditional Operator Service. By Order dated April 6, 1992, the Commission suspended the Traditional Operator Services portion of the tariff through September 4, 1992. On May 27, 1992, the Commission requested that additional information be filed. CBLD filed its response on June 29, 1992, and the record is now complete.

The Commission, having reviewed the evidence of record and being otherwise sufficiently advised, finds that:

- 1. Traditional Operator Services is a service in which CBLD will have a customer relationship with the end-user and will not be provided via traffic aggregators as defined by the Commission's March 27, 1991 Order in Administrative Case No. 330.1
- 2. The rates proposed do not exceed AT&T's maximum approved rates for operator-assisted services, are fair, just and reasonable and should be approved.

Administrative Case No. 330, Policy and Procedures in the Provision of Operator-Assisted Telecommunications Services.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED that CBLD's proposed tariff is approved for services rendered on and after the date of this Order. The tariff pages herein approved are:
