- Page 2 man and his 79 year old wife except there was the possibility of a leaky water closet, water faucets, or leak in the water line from the meter to the Complainant's house.
 - The Complainant employed a plumber to check for leaks in all water appliances and in the water lines. None was found. This complainant has requested an adjustment of the said <u>statement for water usage for the period 8-15-91 to 11-15-91</u>, but the Kentucky American Water Company has steadfastly refused to make an adjustment.

The report of the Commission staff as a result of its investigation was that it appears the Kentucky American Water <u>Company has properly billed my account.</u> This complaint does not contest that based on rates approved by the Commission for the water usage billed, that the billing was proper, but <u>cannot see how this complainant and his wife, both elderly</u> (83 and 79 years respectively) could possibly use 135,000 gallons of water in 82 days or 1600 plus gallons of water <u>per day and there were no leaks in the water lines of</u> appliances. Aside from the bill in question the balance of 1991 (three billing periods) averaged \$37.91 per period.

Wherefore, complainant asks that the Kentucky American Water Company make some reasonable (Specifically state the adjustment to compensate for the unexplained 500% plus increase for the period in question. If the bill cannot be
