O R D E R

This matter arising upon application of Call Home America, Inc. ("Call Home America") filed October 16, 1992 for confidential protection of Exhibit C to its application on the grounds that Call Home America considers the information confidential and proprietary, and it appearing to this Commission as follows:

Call Home America has filed an application for a Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity to operate as a reseller of telecommunications services. As part of its application, Call Home America has attached as Exhibit C evidence of its financial ability to provide the service for which it seeks a certificate. As part of its application, Call Home America requests that the exhibit be protected as confidential.

807 KAR 5:001, Section 7, provides the procedure for obtaining confidential protection of information filed with the Commission. Subsection (2) of that regulation requires any person seeking to protect information as confidential to file a petition setting forth the grounds relied upon and attaching edited copies of the information with the confidential material obscured for

inclusion in the public record. Call Home America has failed to comply with the regulation and its petition should be denied.

This Commission being otherwise sufficiently advised,

IT IS ORDERED that:


1. The request to protect as confidential Exhibit C to Call Home America's application be and is hereby denied.


2. The information sought to be protected shall be held and retained by this Commission as confidential and shall not be open for public inspection for a period of 20 days from the date of this Order to allow Call Home America to file a petition in accordance with the procedure set forth in 807 KAR 5:001, Section 7.


3. If at the expiration of the 20-day period Call Home America has not filed a petition in accordance with the regulation, the information sought to be protected shall be placed in the public record without further Order of the Commission.
