O R D E R

Delta Natural Gas Company ("Delta") has moved for rehearing on the Commission's Order of August 18, 1993. Delta requests that the Commission clarify its earlier Order to state that it "will assert jurisdiction over the physical bypass of LDC [local distribution company] facilities to the full extent of its authority and that a non-interstate pipeline utility must apply for and obtain a Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity to bypass physically the facilities of an LDC in order to deliver gas to an end-user." Motion at 3.


Having reviewed the motion and being otherwise sufficiently advised, the Commission finds that the motion should be denied. In an earlier Order,¹ the Commission addressed the jurisdictional status of non-interstate pipelines. Nothing in the August 18, 1993 Order disturbs the earlier holding.


IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED that Delta's Motion for Rehearing is denied.


