On April 20, 1995, the Commission received the attached letter from Kenneth and Diane Barbee. The Barbees either own or occupy property within 500 feet of the proposed cellular telecommunications facility to be located at 685 Stoney Creek Road, Carlisle, Nicholas County, Kentucky.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED that:

1. Horizon Cellular Telephone Company of Central Kentucky, L.P. ("Horizon Cellular") shall respond to the Barbees' questions by certified letter, within 10 days of the date of this Order.
2. Horizon Cellular shall file a copy of the certified letter and dated receipt, within 7 days of the date on the receipt.

TO WHOM IT MAY CONCERN:

This is a request for intervention of PSC Case No. 95-165. We, Kenneth and Diane Barbee, do not wish for this tower to be constructed this close to our property. We have had our home for sale for over a year now. I'm sure that this will defer us further on the sale of this property and probably keep us from selling it at all. We are asking \$45,000.00. With the construction of this tower, this property will definitely be reduced in value and we will never be able to get that for it. Any monetary loss due to construction should be covered by the Horizon Cellular Telephone of Central Kentucky if they proceed to build this tower.

There are approximately six trees in our yard that will have to be removed according to your notice. All of the trees including the stumps should be the Horizon's responsibility. The fence should also be replaced by them.

We also have other concerns about the tower construction. This tower will be close enough to our house that it would be possible that it could fall on this house should a bad wind storm occur. Also I'm sure that the lights will play a big factor in getting to sleep at night. What about the electrical factor? We already have a lot of lightning strikes around our home. Is Horizon going to furnish lightning rods for our house?

We think that it would be a good idea for Horizon to send a representative to our home so that we can ask these questions that we have and to inform us of their plans.

We have not contacted a law firm at this point, but we are prepared to do so.

Please let us hear from you soon on this matter. Thank you.
