ORDER

By application received September 6, 1995, Hickory Water District ("Hickory Water") requested a deviation from Commission Regulation 807 KAR 5:066, Section 4(4), which provides that each utility shall provide water storage to ensure a minimum of one day's supply of its average daily water usage. Hickory Water states in its application that its average daily water usage, including unaccounted-for water, is approximately 355,507 gallons, and that its current water storage capacity is 300,000 gallons.

The Commission, having reviewed the application and being otherwise sufficiently advised, finds that:

1. Hickory Water is not in compliance with Commission Regulation 807 KAR 5:066, Section 4(4).

2. Because of the time needed to plan, finance, and implement a program to construct water storage facilities, Hickory Water should be given until December 31, 2000 to bring it within compliance of Commission Regulation 807 KAR 5:066, Section 4(4).

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED that:

1. Hickory Water be and it hereby is given until December 31, 2000 to comply with the provisions of 807 KAR 5:066, Section 4(4).

2. Hickory Water shall take all necessary actions to bring its water storage facilities into compliance with Commission regulations prior to December 31, 2000.
