
In response to the application for MSA Limited Partnership for construction and operation of a cellular radio telecommunication service and tower in the yard of 327 Duke Rd., Lexington, Ky, the following reasons for denial shall be listed as follow.

The location is not justified, as it is in a small back yard of an apartment house of a R-4 residential, established neighborhood. First, observing the orange stakes, since the snow has melted, I see the width almost consumes the whole grass area, then the height and massiveness would be even worse to see in this area. I do not understand why this yard was selected as it is certainly not suited for the tower. I feel as owner of the store building at 336 Romany Road that many of the electronics involved could also cause problems with the computer systems, databases and telephone system of my renters business (Wheeler Pharmacy). It also has a potential hazard of falling in a storm, and inviting starlings to roost, posing a health hazard. I think this tower could become a nuisance in later years when the tower would not be sufficient and more towers and equipment would be added, making the matter worse for the area.

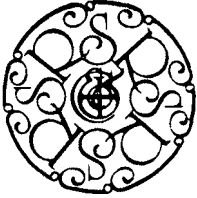
My next objection would be that the Arnett Pritchett Home is next door and is a nursing facility containing elderly women, of which my mother has been a resident for 13 years. I am and have been a regular visitor of at least 5-7 days a week for the entire time she has been there. On her behalf, and the Pritchett home, I also am strongly against the granting of this tower for the same reasons as stated above. Adding one more reason, besides safety, would be that the ladies enjoy the screened porch in the spring, summer and fall as that is a safe place for them to convene and see some forms of nature, as the grass, flowers, squirrels, rabbits and the songbirds who live in the thicket in the back yard. Parties are held regularly in the warm months and I think this would make a problem for my mother and the home as well, besides being terribly unsafe and ugly.

Please deny this proposal based upon the following reasons, and ask them to find another place in the area that is more suitable, as this one is not and opposition will continue if this is granted.

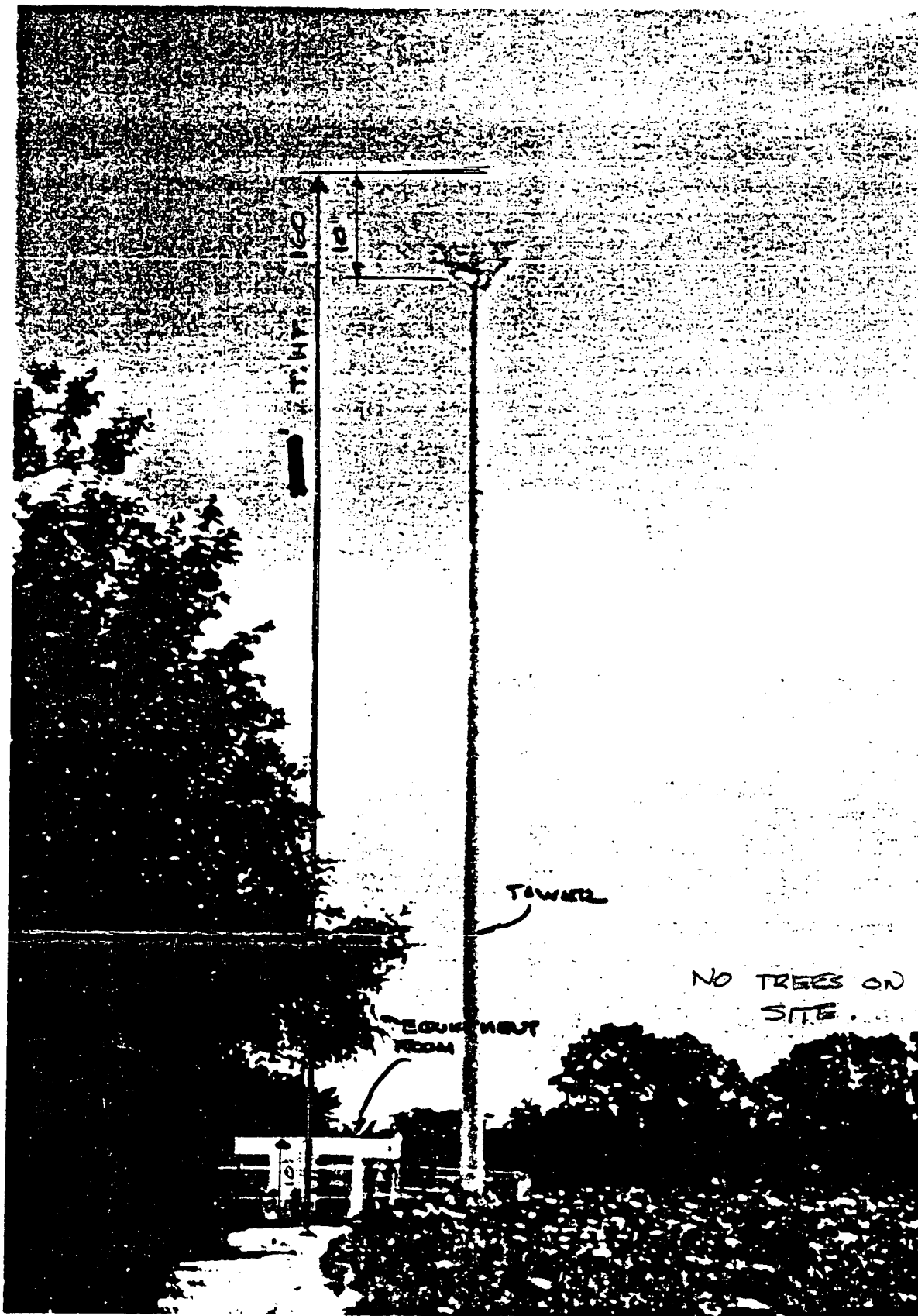
Schubert Realty, owner of property at 358 Duke Road, is very opposed to the installation of a monopole antenna tower and equipment building at 327 Duke Road for the following reasons:

1. There was no specific structure location shown on the area plat and no site plat was submitted. These units could be placed anywhere on the property.
2. This proposed project is a lease of residential land for commercial use. It exceeds height restrictions by 125 feet. It is an illegal and non-conforming use by LFUCG residential zoning code on at least two counts.
3. This installation will be a permanent defacement to this areas' residential quality and can lower property values. It is an example of "creeping commercialization" which has been successfully in this area.
4. The area's small retail convenience center has not been enlarged since the initial zoning.
5. How can this application be approved under the guise of "Public Convenience and Necessity" when the public is inconvenienced and it is only necessary for the lessor to collect rent?
6. This project is a visual environmental impairment to the residents, destructive to residential character, violates zoning laws, lowers property values without compensation and is in no way considered as a public improvement to the area.

Dear Sir or Madame:

I wish both to comment and intervene on the matter of a proposed construction and operation of a cellular radio telecommunication service by Lexington MSA Limited Partnership to be constructed on Duke Road in Lexington. By the enclosed letter from their attorney, you will see that I live within 500 feet of the area.

First, I would like to request that you provide me with a copy of the zoning regulations for the area. There are businesses in the area, but they are all low, small edifices and blend well into the residential environment. A radio tower and "equipment shelter" would be distinctly out of character for the area. I feel this would drastically reduce property values.


Second, I lived on the same block as a similar tower in another town. There were constant problems with birds and their excrement, other animals, children trying to climb the tower and falling, crime and other vandalism around the tower, etc. In addition, it created a hazard in the winter from falling ice on cars and pedestrians.

Third, I would like to request information regarding MSA Limited Partnership. The neighbors have a right to know who the stockholders are, what their purpose is, and what their goals are. The attorney's letter was vague on this issue.

Lastly, but certainly not least, there is evidence in recent years that radiofrequency/electromagnetic rays may be a health hazard or contribute to health problems. I am a medical health professional, and I watch with interest the reports of greater incidences of cancer, particularly testicular cancer, in areas where there are such towers. Arguably, more study is necessary, but since the suspicion exists, the tower should not be constructed in a residential area until the issue is settled.

I have talked with most of my neighbors and we strongly object to this construction. We are willing to obtain legal counsel to explore the issue further if needed. I trust you will keep me apprised of developments.



Dear Sir or Madam:

I wish to register my opposition to the above application to erect a cellular telephone tower at 327 Duke Road in Lexington.

My brother and I own the building adjacent to that site and we believe that this proposed "improvement" is contrary to both the letter and spirit of the LFUCG zoning ordinance. Duke Road is a quiet, one-block residential street with nicely landscaped and well-maintained buildings. The only exception to this is the nonresidential portion on the east side of Duke, near Cooper Drive comprising the Post Office, General Telephone building, and Little Caesar Pizza outlet.

Granting this application would leapfrog this development toward the Providence Road part of the street, and would do so in a grotesquely unprecedented fashion. A 160 foot tower is so out of character with the residential nature of this part of the street as to permanently and substantially block the landscape. It would dominate the skyline from any point on the street and not pleasantly so.


It seems odd that the applicants have not considered an alternate location. Romany Road seems an obvious choice. First, its character, at least for the same one block stretch is predominately commercial. Secondly, it is a higher elevation topographically speaking, than Duke Road and the proposed tower would presumably be shorter than 160 feet to obtain the same absolute elevation. In the

alternative perhaps they should contact Christ the King Cathedral, which maintains a very high steeple indeed.

I have one final point. If this project is approved, there would certainly be a lowering of property values on Duke Road. Our property is currently assessed at \$164,000.00. The erection of this tower will lower this and PVA's office should expect applications for reassessment from Duke Road property owners.

I appreciate your attention to the foregoing and urge you to disapprove this application.

I am writing to express my opposition to the proposal submitted for a cellular radio telecommunication tower to be located at 327 Duke Road in Lexington. This is not only a residential area, but it is also densely populated. Further, it is an older neighborhood with many tall trees lining the street. I believe many, if not all, of us who reside in this area are very opposed to this location for a communications tower.

There appears to be little room at the location selected on which to construct a tower of this height. When Paula and I received the public notice of the intent to build this structure, no mention was made of the type, color, or material used. The notice merely said it was to be a 160 foot monopole with nine antennas. It seems to me the cellular company selected the most ideal spot for their purposes and gave little if any consideration to the area and aesthetics of the neighborhood. The tower will most certainly be an eyesore and a poor attempt to squeeze a communications tower into a theoretically perfect location.

Further, it may be of some interest to know that the University of Kentucky Medical Center helicopter flies in this area nearly every day. The take-off and landing patterns are in very close proximity to the location of the proposed tower.

As residents of this neighborhood, Paula and I are very much opposed to this proposal and hope approval for the construction of this tower will not be granted.



I am writing to express my concern about the cellular telephone tower facility proposed for 327 Duke Road in Lexington and to request an intervention hearing on this matter.

The proposed location seems totally inappropriate for a 150 foot tower, nine antennas which raise the total height to 160 feet and a shelter building. It is my understanding that technology will soon be in place to enable telecommunications companies to simply locate very small dishes, similar to the newly reduced satellite dishes for television, on existing telephone or other poles, eliminating the need for these huge, unsightly towers altogether. I think we need to either wait for this technology or find an appropriate place to locate this gigantic equipment.

This proposal raises a number of questions regarding appropriate land use, safety issues, impact on the surrounding neighborhood and many more. 
