### ORDER

Kentucky Power Company, d/b/a American Electric Power ("Kentucky Power"), is a Kentucky corporation engaged in the generation, transmission and distribution of electricity to the public for compensation for lights, heat, power and other uses and is a utility subject to Commission jurisdiction. KRS 278.010.

KRS 278.280(2) directs the Commission to prescribe rules and regulations for the performance of services by utilities. Pursuant to this statutory directive, the Commission promulgated 807 KAR 5:006, Section 26(1)(a), which requires utilities to notify the Commission within two hours following discovery of any utility-related accident which results in death or shock or burn requiring medical treatment or a similar medical facility. In addition, the Commission promulgated 807 KAR 5:041, Section 3(1), which requires utility facilities to be maintained in accordance with the National Electrical Safety Code, 1990 Edition ("NESC"). The NESC, Section 21, 218A1, requires the trimming of trees which may interfere with ungrounded supply conductors. Commission Staff submitted to the Commission a Utility Accident Investigation Report dated October 28, 1996,

attached hereto as Appendix A, which alleges that on July 15, 1996, Ivan Johnson was walking through a yard in Yellow Flats, Weeksbury, Kentucky, when he lifted a metal clothes line with his right hand. The clothes line was attached to a tree which was in contact with 120/240 Volt secondary distribution lines. Mr. Johnson suffered burns on his right hand and right foot and was hospitalized overnight. The Utility Accident Investigation Report notes two probable violations of Commission regulations: 1) 807 KAR 5:006, Section 26(1)(a), due to the utility's failure to notify the Commission within two hours of discovering an accident resulting in burns requiring medical treatment at a hospital; and 2) 807 KAR 5:041, Section 3(1), due to a violation of the NESC by failing to trim a tree which allowed the tree to come in contact with an ungrounded supply conductor.

The Commission, on its own motion, HEREBY ORDERS that:

- Kentucky Power shall submit to the Commission within 20 days of the date of this Order a written response to the allegations contained in the Utility Accident Investigation Report.
- 2. Kentucky Power shall appear on February 13, 1997, at 10:00 a.m., Eastern Standard Time, in Hearing Room 1 of the Commission's offices at 730 Schenkel Lane, Frankfort, Kentucky, to present evidence concerning the incident which is the subject of the Utility Accident Investigation Report, specifically the alleged violations of Commission regulations 807 KAR 5:006, Section 26(1)(a), and 807 KAR 5:041, Section 3(1), and to show cause, if any it can, why it should not be subject to the penalties of KRS 278.990 for its alleged failure to comply with the aforementioned Commission regulations.

- 3. The Utility Accident Investigation Report dated October 28, 1996 is hereby made a part of the record of this case.
- 4. Any requests for an informal conference with the Commission Staff shall be set forth in writing and filed with the Commission within 20 days of the date of this Order.

On July 15, 1996 at 6:19 pm, our call center received a report of an electrical contact involving Ivan Johnson at Weeksbury, Ky. The Pikeville dispatcher relayed this information to Greg Justice, general servicer, in the Floyd county area, at 6:27 pm. Charles Perry, dispatcher at Coalrun Service Center, relayed this to me at 6:30 pm. I attempted to contact members of the commission at their home numbers in this order: Bob Ueltschi, John Land, Elie El-Rouaiheb, Martha Morton and then Claude G. Rhoer Jr. and received no answer. I then called Martha back and left a message on her answering machine at 6:40 pm. detailing the accident with the information I had, and that I would call the office the following day. I called the P.S.C. the morning of the 16, and Martha returned my call at 9:10 am. She informed me at this time we had the old home listing for her and Bob. I now have and updated listing. Bob Ueltschi called me and we set a meeting time for July 19, at 8:00 am.

I then proceeded to the site at Weeksbury arriving at 7:50 pm. I met Greg Justice and we discussed what he had found when he arrived at the site. He did not change any thing at the site before I arrived. I took 6 pictures of a 12 exposure roll of 35 mm film. The rest of the film was exposed. We measured for voltage on the metal clothes line were the reported contact was made, and measured 0.5 volts. I talked with Lucille Johnson and she gave me this description of the accident: It was raining and at app. 1:10 pm, he walked from his sister-in-laws trailer, crossing the yard and lifted a metal clothes line with his right hand. At this time he felt a severe shock and was burned on his hand and right foot. He continued on to his house and called a neighbor to take him to the hospital. He was taken to Our Lady Of The Way Hospital in

I attempted to contact Mr. Johnson on 7-16 and 7-17, and finally talked with him on 7-18 at 2:10 pm. He reported he was released from the hospital on 7-16 at noon. The Dr. told him to rest and return in 10 days for a follow-up visit. He said he was still feeling weak. Mr. Johnson is a 62 year old white male.

Bob Ueltschi arrived at Coalrun Service Center on July 19, and we had a discussion of the accident. We then traveled to the site and took measurements of the conductors and the distance the tree was from the line. A copy of these measurements, trouble ticket, map, telephone numbers, and a sketch are attached. We talked with Mrs. Johnson and she stated Ivan had returned to the Dr. because he was having problems sleeping.

Also I reviewed the record on the last pole and line inspection. The last date was July 27, 1994.



AEP Sketch of Accident Site




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

This letter is to acknowledge receipt of your letter of August 8, 1995 concerning 807 KAR 5.006, Section 26.

In reviewing Section 26, it is our understanding that reporting of accidents, property damage or loss of service, may be accomplished "by telephone or electronic mail." However, your cover letter indicates use of electronic mail (voice mailbox or Fax No.) during "non-office hours" is not considered "appropriate notification." Based upon our understanding of Section 26, we intend to notify the commission by telephone and/or electronic mail during and outside of normal business hours in order to comply with the two-hour reporting requirement. Our use of electronic mail during "non-office" hours will be limited to those occasions when we are unable to reach a Commission representative within the two-hour reporting time frame.
