<u>ORDER</u>

On May 15, 1997, the Spears Water Company ("Spears Water") applied for permission to deviate from Commission regulation 807 KAR 5:006, Section 4(4), which requires that each utility maintain minimum water storage of one day's supply of its average daily usage. By Order of January 29, 1992 in Case No. 91-147,¹ Spears Water was required to bring its water storage facilities into compliance with Commission regulations by July 1, 1997.

Spears Water subsequently filed a letter from the City of Nicholasville ("Nicholasville") stating that it would provide Spears Water storage for the next several years from its storage capacity.

The Commission, having reviewed the application and information submitted subsequent thereto, and being otherwise sufficiently advised, finds that:

1. The total water storage capacity of Spears Water is approximately 235,000 gallons.

2. Spears Water's average daily water usage is approximately 525,000 gallons per day.

Nicholasville is willing to provide Spears Water with the additional needed 3. storage capacity for the next several years.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED that:

Spears Water is granted permission to deviate from the provisions of 807 1. KAR 5:066, Section 4(4), until July 1, 2003.

Spears Water shall take all necessary action to bring its water storage 2. facilities into compliance with Commission regulations by July 1, 2003.
