2. WirelessCo shall file a copy of the certified letter and dated receipt, within 7 days of the date on the receipt.

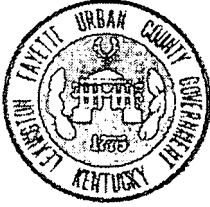


The Lexington-Fayette Urban County Government (hereinafter referred to as LFUCG) wishes to state its concerns regarding the above-captioned application for a cellular tower and equipment shelter for property located at 3250 Georgetown Road. I specifically request that the following items be addressed:

1. Addition of a condition by the PSC that the tower be removed if it ever ceases to be used as a cellular transmitting facility.
2. Information as to proposed screening/buffering of the proposed facilities from adjoining properties.
3. We would like assurances that Wirelesco would make the facility available for collocation of transmitting facilities by other service providers in the future at a reasonable cost so as to minimize the need for other towers in the community.

The LFUCG's Cellular Tower Committee has given this request a preliminary review, and wishes to review the requested information in the hope that any concerns can be addressed short of intervention. I am also sending a copy of this letter to Mr. Tom Powell, representing Wirelesco, et al. I would like to note that Mr. Powell has been very helpful in providing us information regarding this and other pending applications in a timely fashion. We appreciate his willingness to discuss this matter with the LFUCG and concerned citizens in the area.

The Lexington-Fayette Urban County Government looks forward to a response from the applicant and/or the Public Service Commission on these requests.
