APPROVAL OF THE INTERCONNECTION AGREEMENT NEGOTIATED BY CINCINNATI BELL TELEPHONE COMPANY AND TELIGENT, INC. PURSUANT TO SECTIONS 251 AND 252 OF THE TELECOMMUNICATIONS ACT OF 1996

On July 30, 1999, Cincinnati Bell Telephone Company (CBT) and Teligent, Inc. (Teligent) submitted to the Commission their negotiated agreement for interconnection of their networks, the unbundling of specific network elements, and the resale of CBT's services. The agreement was negotiated pursuant to the Telecommunications Act of 1996 (1996 Act), 47 U.S.C. Sections 251 and 252. Section 252(e) of the 1996 Act requires the parties to an interconnection agreement adopted by negotiation to submit the agreement for approval to the Commission.

The Commission has reviewed the agreement and finds that no portion of the agreement discriminates against a telecommunications carrier not a party to the agreement. The Commission also finds that the implementation of this agreement is consistent with the public interest, convenience, and necessity. Certain items in the July 30, 1999 agreement are labeled "TBD" (to be determined) or "ICB" (individual case basis). When CBT and Teligent negotiate rates for these items, they shall submit them for review as amendments to this agreement.

Teligent must comply with all relevant Commission mandates for serving in this Commonwealth.

The Commission, having been otherwise sufficiently advised, HEREBY ORDERS that:

1. The negotiated agreement between CBT and Teligent is approved.

2. Teligent shall file a tariff for local service prior to providing local service giving 30 days' notice to the Commission and shall comply with all Commission regulations and orders as directed.

3. The negotiated rates for items which are labeled "TBD" or "ICB" in the agreement approved herein shall be submitted for Commission review as amendments to the July 30, 1999 agreement.
