This matter is before the Commission upon the motion of Tritel Communications, Inc., Tritel Finance, Inc., GTE Wireless of the South, Inc., Kentucky CGSA, Inc., and Crown Communication Inc. (collectively "Applicants") to strike a letter dated August 21, 2000 signed by James F. McDonald in his capacity as Mayor of the city of Seneca Gardens, Jefferson County, Kentucky, and filed in the record herein on August 23, 2000. The letter expressed the opposition of the City Commission to the proposed application for construction of a cellular tower at the location known as Seneca Park, Jefferson County, Kentucky. In addition, the intervenors herein have filed a motion to

enlarge the time for the filing of post-hearing briefs by the parties from October 30, 2000

to November 13, 2000. Each motion was opposed by respective counsel.

After review of the pleadings and the record, and being otherwise sufficiently

advised, the Commission HEREBY ORDERS that:

1. The Applicants' motion to strike is overruled, but the Commission

acknowledges that matters that are jurisdictional to the local planning and zoning

authority will not be revisited by the Commission in making its decision.

2. The intervenors' motion is granted and the deadline for filing post-hearing

briefs is rescheduled from October 30 to November 13, 2000.
