## <u>ORDER</u>

On May 30, 2000, Crown Communication Inc. ("Crown"), Tritel Communications, Inc. and Tritel Finance, Inc. ("Applicants") filed an application seeking a Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity to construct and operate a wireless telecommunications facility. The proposed facility consists of a guyed antenna tower not to exceed 275 feet in height, with attached antenna, to be located at 4768 State Road 505, Horsebranch, Ohio County, Kentucky. The coordinates for the proposed facility are North Latitude 37° 23' 55.04" by West Longitude 86° 42' 51.68". Crown has requested authorization to construct a cell site in Ohio County, and Tritel has provided evidence that the public convenience and necessity will be served by the proposed construction.

The Applicants have provided information regarding the structure of the tower, safety measures, and antenna design criteria for the proposed facility. Based upon the application, the design of the tower and foundation conforms to applicable nationally

recognized building standards, and a Licensed Professional Engineer has certified the plans.

The Applicants have notified the County Judge/Executive of the proposed construction and have filed evidence of the appropriate notices provided pursuant to 807 KAR 5:063. The notices solicited any comments and informed the recipients of their right to request intervention. To date, no public comments have been filed with the Commission.

The Applicants have filed applications with the Federal Aviation Administration ("FAA") and the Kentucky Airport Zoning Commission ("KAZC") seeking approval for the construction and operation of the proposed facility. Both decisions are pending.

Pursuant to KRS 278.280, the Commission is required to determine proper practices to be observed when it finds, upon complaint or on its own motion, that the facilities of any utility subject to its jurisdiction are unreasonable, unsafe, improper, or insufficient. To assist the Commission in its efforts to comply with this mandate, Crown should notify the Commission if it does not use this antenna tower to provide service in the manner set out in its application and this Order. Upon receipt of such notice, the Commission may, on its own motion, institute proceedings to consider the proper practices, including removal of the unused antenna tower, which should be observed by Crown.

The Commission, having considered the evidence of record and being otherwise sufficiently advised, finds that the Applicants have demonstrated that a facility is necessary to provide adequate utility service and therefore should be granted a Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity to construct the proposed facility.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED that:

1. Crown is granted a Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity to

construct a wireless telecommunications facility. The proposed facility consists of a guyed

antenna tower not to exceed 275 feet in height, with attached antenna, and is to be located

at 4768 State Road 505, Horsebranch, Ohio County, Kentucky. The coordinates for the

proposed facility are North Latitude 37° 23' 55.04" by West Longitude 86° 42' 51.68".

2. The Applicants shall file a copy of the final decisions regarding their pending

FAA and KAZC applications for the proposed construction within 10 days of receiving these

decisions.

3. Crown shall immediately notify the Commission in writing, if, after the antenna

tower is built and utility service is commenced, the tower is not used for a period of 3

months in the manner authorized by this Order.
