O R D E R

On October 9, 2000, Muhlenberg County Water District No. 3 ("Muhlenberg No. 3") applied for authority to increase certain non-recurring charges. Muhlenberg No. 3 has provided adequate evidence of the individual expenses incurred to provide the services associated with the proposed charges.

The commission, having reviewed the record and being sufficiently advised, finds that:

1. The proposed charges are equal to the expenses incurred to provide the associated services.
2. The charges set forth in Appendix A to this Order are fair, just, and reasonable and should be approved.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED that:

1. The charges in Appendix A are approved for services rendered on and after January 1, 2001.
2. The proposed tariff sheets filed by Muhlenberg No. 3 are approved as filed.

APPENDIX A

APPENDIX TO AN ORDER OF THE KENTUCKY PUBLIC SERVICE COMMISSION IN CASE NO. 2000-467 DATED DECEMBER 12, 2000

The following rates and charges are prescribed for the customers in the area service by Muhlenberg County Water District No. 3. All other rates and charges not specifically mentioned herein shall remain the same as those in effect under authority of the Commission prior to the effective date of this Order.

Water Connection Fees

5/8 Inch x 3/4 Inch Meter	\$ 350.00
1 Inch Meter	550.00
2 Inch Meter	750.00
4 Inch Meter	Actual Cost With Deposit*

*A four (4) inch meter tap will require a deposit of \$5,000 from the customer at the time a request is made for service. The amount charged for the meter tap will be the actual cost incurred by the district. If the cost incurred by the district is less than the \$5,000 deposit, the customer will have the difference refunded. If the cost incurred by the district exceeds the \$5,000 deposit, the customer will owe the difference to the utility. The \$5,000 deposit is for installation of service and will be in addition to the customer deposit that is collected that ensures payment for water usage.
