## <u>ORDER</u>

On October 9, 2000, Crown Communication Inc. ("Crown") and Tritel Communications, Inc. and Tritel Finance, Inc. ("Applicants") filed an application seeking a Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity ("CPCN") to construct and operate a wireless telecommunications facility. The proposed facility consisted of a self-supporting antenna tower not to exceed 265 feet in height, with attached antenna, to be located at 10703 Caps Lane, Louisville, Jefferson County, Kentucky (the "Stone Street tower"). The coordinates for the facility as proposed in October 2000 were North Latitude 38° 6' 17.7" by West Longitude 85° 49' 29.2". On November 30, 2000, this Commission granted the Applicants a CPCN to construct the Stone Street tower.

On July 18, 2001, the Applicants moved the Commission to amend its previous Order and allow the Applicants to relocate the tower approximately 210 feet from the site previously approved.

Based upon the application, the design of the tower and foundation conforms to applicable nationally recognized building standards, and a Licensed Professional Engineer has certified the plans.

Pursuant to 807 KAR 5:063, the Applicants have notified and received approval from the local planning commission. In addition, the Applicants have filed evidence demonstrating that previous notices provided pursuant to 807 KAR 5:063 remain in force. The Applicants have filed applications with and received approvals from the Federal Aviation Administration and the Kentucky Airport Zoning Commission for the construction and operation of the newly proposed facility.

The Commission, having considered the evidence of record and being otherwise sufficiently advised, finds that the Applicants have demonstrated that the slight change in location of the facility does not negate the previous findings that the tower is necessary.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED that:

1. The Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity granted to Crown to construct a wireless telecommunications facility is amended to the extent that the coordinates for the facility are now North Latitude  $38^{\circ}$  06' 16" by West Longitude  $85^{\circ}$  49' 30".

Except for the change of location as described herein, the Order of November
30, 2000 remains in full force and effect.
