## ORDER

On June 12, 2002, West Laurel Water Association, Inc. (West Laurel) submitted an application for a Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity to construct and finance a \$2,136,000 waterworks construction project. The project, Water System Improvements, Project No. 1999116, consists of the construction of a one million gallon water storage tank, the upgrading of the existing booster pump station, and the installation of approximately 5.6 miles of 8-inch and 1.3 miles of 4-inch water transmission and distribution lines, to provide water service to approximately 5 additional customers. West Laurel proposes to finance the construction of the project through:

 A loan in the amount of \$1,536,000 from the United States of America, acting by and through the U.S. Department of Agriculture, Rural Development (the USDA-RD) for a 40-year period with an interest rate not to exceed 5.00 percent.

- A USDA-RD grant in the amount of \$500,000.
- An Applicant contribution in the amount of \$100,000.

West Laurel's application was made pursuant to KRS 278.023, which requires the Commission to accept agreements between water utilities and the U.S. Department of Agriculture or the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development and to issue the necessary orders to implement the terms of such agreements within 30 days of satisfactory completion of the minimum filing requirements. Given that minimum filing requirements were met in this case on June 12, 2002, KRS 278.023 does not grant the Commission any discretionary authority to modify or reject any portion of this agreement.

#### IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED that:

- 1. West Laurel is granted a Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity for the proposed construction project.
  - 2. West Laurel's proposed plan of financing with USDA-RD is accepted.
- 3. West Laurel is authorized to obtain a loan from USDA-RD not to exceed \$1,536,000.
- 4. The rates set out in Appendix A, which is attached hereto and incorporated herein, are the rates approved for service rendered on and after the date of this Order.
- 5. West Laurel shall file a copy of the as-built drawings and a certified statement that the construction has been satisfactorily completed in accordance

with the contract plans and specifications within 60 days of the substantial completion of

the construction certificated herein.

6. West Laurel shall notify the Commission one week prior to the actual start

of construction and at the 50 percent completion point.

7. Three years from the effective date of this Order, West Laurel shall file an

income statement, along with any pro forma adjustments, in sufficient detail to

demonstrate that the rates approved herein are sufficient to meet its operating

expenses and annual debt service requirements.

8. West Laurel shall monitor the adequacies of the expanded water

distribution system after construction. If the level of service is inadequate or declining or

the pressure to any customer is outside the requirements of 807 KAR 5:066, Section

5(1), West Laurel shall take immediate action to maintain the level of service in

conformance with the regulations of the Commission.

Nothing contained herein shall be deemed a warranty of the Commonwealth of

Kentucky, or any agency thereof, of the financing herein accepted.
