O R D E R

On April 9, 2007, West Shelby Water District (“West Shelby”) notified the Commission that it intended to modify its tariff to provide free water service to its commissioners. By Order dated May 31, 2007, the Commission noted that it had previously rejected similar proposals for such service as unreasonable and ordered West Shelby to show cause within 20 days why the proposed rate schedule was reasonable and should not be denied.

By email received July 6, 2007, followed by U.S. Mail received July 9, 2007, West Shelby requested an extension of time of 20 days to respond to the Commission’s Order. As grounds for its request, West Shelby stated, “Due to vacation schedules of employees and holidays, [it] has been ‘short-handed’ and unable to respond within the ordered time.” In addition, by email also received on July 6, 2007, followed by U.S. Mail received on July 9, 2007, West Shelby filed its response to the Order.

CONCLUSION

The Commission finds that West Shelby has presented sufficient grounds to justify an extension of time within which to respond to the Commission’s Order.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED that West Shelby's request for an extension of time of 20 days within which to respond to the Commission's Order is granted.
