ORDER

On July 2, 2007, the Green-Taylor Water District ("Green-Taylor") applied for permission to deviate from Administrative Regulation 807 KAR 5:066, Section 4(4), which requires that each utility maintain minimum water storage of one day's supply of its average daily usage. Green-Taylor states in its application that its average daily water usage, including unaccounted-for water, is approximately 975,000 gallons, and that its current water storage capacity is 860,000 gallons.

The Commission, having reviewed the application and being otherwise sufficiently advised, finds that:

- Green-Taylor is not in compliance with Administrative Regulation 807 KAR
 5:066, Section 4(4).
- 2. Green-Taylor states in its application that funds are already in place from a state grant to replace its existing 60,000-gallon Black Gnat Water Storage Tank with a 500,000-gallon elevated water storage tank.
- 3. Because of the time needed to plan, finance, and construct water storage facilities, Green-Taylor should have until January 1, 2009 to comply with Administrative Regulation 807 KAR 5:066, Section 4(4).

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED that:

1. Green-Taylor shall have until January 1, 2009 to comply with the provisions of Administrative Regulation 807 KAR 5:066, Section 4(4).

2. Green-Taylor shall take all necessary actions to bring its water storage facilities into compliance with Commission regulations prior to January 1, 2009.
