## ORDER

On August 9, 2007, Kentucky-American Water Company ("Kentucky-American") and Tri-Village Water District ("Tri-Village") filed a joint application requesting Commission approval of the transfer of assets and a change of control of Tri-Village. Commission Staff issued a data request on September 14, 2007. Responses were originally due on September 28, 2007, but the parties filed a timely motion to extend the response deadline to October 5, 2007. The Commission, having reviewed the parties' motion, finds sufficient cause exists to grant their motion.

The proposed transfer of assets and change of control is pursuant to KRS 278.020, which requires that the Commission find that Kentucky-American has the financial, technical, and managerial abilities to provide reasonable utility service in accordance with the law and in the public interest. KRS 278.020(6) requires the Commission to reach a final decision on the proposed transfer within 60 days of the filing of the application unless it is necessary, for good cause shown, to continue the application period. That initial 60-day period in this proceeding ends on October 8,

2007. If good cause for a continuance exists, the Commission may extend its review for

an additional 60 days.

Because responses to the data requests are not due to be submitted until one

business day prior to the initial statutory deadline, the Commission also finds that good

cause exists to extend the review period an additional 60 days to and including

December 7, 2007.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED that:

1. Joint Applicants' motion is granted.

2. Joint Applicants shall respond to Commission Staff's First Data Request

on or before October 5, 2007.

3. The statutory 60-day review period ending on October 8, 2007 is extended

an additional 60 days to and including December 7, 2007.
