<u>O R D E R</u>

Bullock Pen Water District ("Bullock Pen") has applied to the Commission for a Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity to construct proposed waterworks improvements, for approval of its plan for financing the construction, for an increase in rates, nonrecurring charges, and tariff revisions. In its filing, Bullock Pen requested permission to deviate from the filing requirements of 807 KAR 5:001, Section 6 and Section 10(7)(b).

Section 6 of that regulation requires that the utility file financial data for a 12-month period ending within 90 days from the filing of the application. In support of its request for permission to deviate from this requirement, Bullock Pen states that there has been no change that is material in nature in the financial condition of the utility since December 31, 2007, the date of the most recently published financial data available for Bullock Pen.

807 KAR 5:001, Section 10(7)(b), requires that the utility file a capital construction budget. Bullock Pen states that its construction projects occur on a caseby-case basis, and accordingly, it does not provide for or maintain a capital construction budget.

807 KAR 5:001, Section 14, provides the Commission with the authority to permit deviations from its regulations for good cause shown. Having reviewed the filing and being otherwise sufficiently advised, the Commission finds that the requested deviations are reasonable and should be granted.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED that Bullock Pen's request for permission to deviate from the filing requirements of 807 KAR 5:001, Section 6 and Section 10(7)(b). is granted.
