ORDER

On June 19, 2025, Jessamine County Water District No. 1 (Jessamine District No. 1) filed a formal motion to be relieved of their obligation to file a rate case application. Previously, the Commission found that within three years of its June 20, 2022 Order, Jessamine District No. 1 should file an application for a general adjustment in rates, an application for an alternative rate filing, or a formal motion with a detailed analysis of its rates and state the reasons why no rate modification is necessary. By Order dated September 26, 2024, the Commission ordered Jessamine District No. 1 to file an application for a general adjustment in rates, an alternative rate filing, or a motion containing a detailed analysis of why no rate adjustment is necessary on or before June 20, 2025. The Commission specified that Jessamine District No. 1 was to use data from its 2024 Annual Report to support its motion.

On August 9, 2022, Jessamine District No. 1 filed a purchased water adjustment because of an increase in the wholesale rates charged to it by the City of Nicholasville, Kentucky (Nicholasville), one of its wholesale water providers.

On April 12, 2024, Jessamine District No. 1 filed into the post-case correspondence record of this proceeding, a Rate Study Report using 2022 as the test

year and the supporting Excel file, both of which were prepared by Sam Reid, a Kentucky Rural Water Association (KRWA) rate consultant. According to Jessamine District No. 1, the Rate Study recently completed by KRWA indicates that no rate increase is needed at this time and that Jessamine District No. 1 is financially sound.

The Commission finds it reasonable to accept Jessamine District No. 1's analysis that a rate application is not required. Jessamine District No. 1 should continue to assess its finances and consider filing a base rate application every three to five years, depending on its financial performance.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED that a rate application is not required to be filed at this time.
