ORDER

On June 17, 2025, Sharpsburg Water District (Sharpsburg District) tendered an application requesting approval to adjust its rates pursuant to the purchased water adjustment procedure set forth in KRS 278.015 and 807 KAR 5:068. On June 24, 2025, the Commission notified Sharpsburg District that its application was rejected for certain filing deficiencies. On June 25, 2025, Sharpsburg District submitted further documentation to correct the filing deficiencies, and the application was deemed filed as of June 25, 2025.

LEGAL STANDARD

In accordance with KRS 278.015, when a wholesale supplier selling water to a water district increases its rates, the water district has the authority to increase its rate commensurate with the wholesale supplier. The water district must file, within the statutory and regulatory deadlines, a copy of the notice from the wholesale supplier showing the increase in the wholesale rate, and a statement of the volume of purchased water used to calculate the rate adjustment. The Commission shall approve the filing by order after the above documents are filed.

DISCUSSION AND FINDINGS

Sharpsburg District purchases water from Bath County Water District (Bath District) and the city of Carlisle (Carlisle). Bath District notified Sharpsburg District that its wholesale rate would increase by \$1.46 per 1,000 gallons from \$4.24 per 1,000 gallons to \$5.70 per 1,000 gallons,¹ effective July 15, 2025.² Sharpsburg District proposed to increase the water rates to its customers effective July 15, 2025,³ to reflect the increased cost of purchased water from Bath District.

Unaccounted-for Water Loss

Commission regulation 807 KAR 5:066, Section 6(3), states that for ratemaking purposes a utility's unaccounted-for water loss shall not exceed 15 percent of the total water produced and purchased, excluding water consumed by a utility in its own operations. In its 2022 Annual Report filed with the Commission, Sharpsburg District reported a water loss of 16.2030 percent.⁴ In its 2023 Annual Report filed with the Commission, Sharpsburg District reported a water loss of 20.8909 percent.⁵ In its 2024 Annual Report filed with the Commission, Sharpsburg District reported a water loss of

16.6071 percent.⁶ Sharpsburg District's three-year water loss average is 17.9003.⁷ The approximate cost of Sharpsburg District's total water loss using a three-year average is \$112,956.81.⁸

The Commission is placing greater emphasis on monitoring utilities that consistently exceed the 15 percent unaccounted-for water loss threshold. The Commission encourages Sharpsburg District to continue to pursue reasonable actions to reduce its unaccounted-for water loss.

Financial Condition and Rates

Based on a review of Commission records, Sharpsburg District last sought an alternative rate adjustment in Case No. 2022-00348.⁹ In that case, the Commission authorized an increase to Sharpsburg District's rates of \$159,111 or 17.64 percent.¹⁰ Sharpsburg District has not requested another rate adjustment since the last alternative rate filing adjustment mentioned above. All other rate adjustments since Case 2022-00348 were a result of purchase water adjustments.

Although Sharpsburg District received approval for a rate increase in May 2023, based upon a review of the annual and audit reports filed with the Commission, Sharpsburg District's rate based income, or adjusted net income minus principal

payments, was negative from 2020 through 2024. Cash basis income, or rate based income plus depreciation, was negative in 2021 but improved in 2022 through 2024 because of the rate increase in 2023. A chart summarizing cash basis and rate based income is presented below.

The Commission finds that Sharpsburg District should monitor its operating performance annually and file future rate cases no less than every three to five years, depending on operating performance, to ensure that its revenue is sufficient to support adequate and reliable service.

Purchased Water Adjustment Factor

In its application, Sharpsburg District proposed a purchased water adjustment factor of \$1.50 per 1,000 gallons. Upon review of the information submitted with the application, during the 12 months ended April 30, 2025, Sharpsburg District purchased 101,560,000 gallons of water from Bath District and 25,543,400 gallons of water from Carlisle and sold 98,474,800 gallons of water to its customers. In contrast to the calculation set forth in the application, the increase in the cost of purchased water from Bath District is \$148,277.60, resulting in a purchased water adjustment factor of \$1.51 per 1,000 gallons. No rate changes occurred from Carlisle.

The Commission finds that the proposed purchased water adjustment factor of \$1.50 be rejected in favor of a purchased water adjustment factor of \$1.51 per 1,000 gallons, as calculated in Appendix A and the rates set forth in Appendix B to this Order be adopted as fair, just and reasonable and should be approved for water service rendered by Sharpsburg District on and after July 15, 2025. These rates are supported by evidence of the increase in rates from Sharpsburg District's wholesale water supplier and the volume of purchased water used to calculate the rates in accordance with KRS 278.015.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED that:

- 1. The rates proposed by Sharpsburg District are denied.
- 2. The purchased water adjustment factor of \$1.51 per 1,000 gallons is approved.
- 3. The rates as set forth in Appendix B to this Order are approved for water service rendered by Sharpsburg District on and after July 15, 2025.

4. Within 20 days of the date of service of this Order, Sharpsburg District shall file with the Commission, using the Commission's electronic Tariff Filing System, revised tariff sheets showing the rates approved herein.

5. This case is closed and removed from the Commission's docket.
