



customers to LED lights once replacement is necessary. Salt River Electric stated that since the filing of the complaint, Ms. Burnett's outdoor light had been removed at her request. Salt River Electric agreed that should Ms. Burnett still want a sodium vapor light bulb, Salt River Electric would offer her one of the recently discovered non-LED lights.

On November 24, 2025, the Commission entered an Order finding that Salt River Electric's offer to accommodate Ms. Burnett with a non-LED lamp was rendered moot by the removal of the exterior light at her request. The Commission further found that Ms. Burnett should have 20 days from the date of entry of this Order to respond to Salt River Electric's answer and to show cause why her complaint should not be dismissed as satisfied or moot, and further that if no response is filed, the complaint should be dismissed.


Ms. Burnett did not respond to the Commission's November 24, 2025 Order. The Commission finds that her complaint should be dismissed as satisfied.

1. The Complaint of Karen J. Burnett is dismissed as satisfied.
