ORDER

On July 15, 2026, Kentucky Power Company (Kentucky Power) filed a motion requesting an extension of time to respond to Appalachian Citizens' Law Center and Mountain Association's (collectively, Joint Intervenors) Post-Hearing Data Request, Item 7.¹ For the reasons outlined below, the Commission finds good cause to grant the motion, and the post-hearing procedural schedule should be amended as a result.

A hearing in this matter was held on June 30, 2026, and a post-hearing procedural schedule was issued on July 6, 2026.² Pursuant to the order, all parties filed post-hearing data requests and Kentucky Power filed its responses on July 15, 2026. With its responses, Kentucky Power filed a motion seeking additional time to respond to Joint Intervenors' Post-Hearing Request for Information, Item 7. Kentucky Power requested

an additional week to prepare and provide the information requested.³ Kentucky Power asserted that despite its best efforts, it was unable to “review correspondence for responsiveness and confidentiality.”⁴

The Commission finds that Kentucky Power has provided good cause to grant its request for an extension. Kentucky Power should file the remaining response to Joint Intervenors’ Request for Information no later than July 22, 2026. In order to give Joint Intervenors adequate time to review the response and prepare its brief, if it so chooses, the Commission finds it should amend the post-hearing procedural schedule.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED that:

1. Kentucky Power’s motion for extension of time is granted.
2. Kentucky Power shall file the remaining response to Joint Intervenors’ Request for Information no later than July 22, 2026.
3. The post-hearing procedural schedule established in the July 6, 2026 Order is hereby amended.
4. Parties, should they choose, shall file a brief memorandum in support of its respective post-hearing position on or before July 27, 2026.
5. Parties, should they choose, shall file a response brief limited to the issues raised in the respective post-hearing position on or before August 5, 2026.
6. This case shall stand submitted for a decision by the Commission effective 12:01 a.m. Eastern Daylight Time, August 6, 2026.
