O R D E R

On January 1, 2026, Harrison County Water Association, Inc. (Harrison Water) tendered an application requesting approval to adjust its rates pursuant to the purchased water adjustment procedure set forth in KRS 278.012 and 807 KAR 5:068. On January 7, 2026, the Commission notified Harrison Water that its application was rejected for certain filing deficiencies. On January 15, 2026, Harrison Water submitted further documentation to correct the filing deficiencies, and the application was deemed filed as of January 15, 2026.

LEGAL STANDARD

In accordance with KRS 278.012, when a wholesale supplier selling water to a water association increases its rates, the water association has the authority to increase its rate commensurate with the wholesale supplier. The water association must file, within the statutory and regulatory deadlines, a copy of the notice from the wholesale supplier showing the increase in the wholesale rate, and a statement of the volume of purchased water used to calculate the rate adjustment. The Commission shall approve the filing by order after the above documents are filed.

## DISCUSSION AND FINDINGS

Harrison Water purchases water from the city of Cynthiana (Cynthiana), Kentucky-American Water Company (Kentucky-American) at several intake locations, and Nicholas County Water District (Nicholas District). Kentucky-American notified Harrison Water that its wholesale rate would increase by \$6.0591 per 1,000 gallons, from \$2.25 per 1,000 gallons to \$8.3091 per 1,000 gallons for the Millersburg intake, and by \$3.3564 per 1,000 gallons, from \$4.9527 per 1,000 gallons to \$8.3091 per 1,000 gallons for two intake locations, 353 Centerville and U.S. 60, that are both located in Cynthiana, effective December 16, 2025.<sup>1</sup> Harrison Water proposes to increase the water rates to its customers effective January 13, 2026, to reflect the increased cost of purchased water from Kentucky-American.<sup>2</sup> Nicholas District and Cynthiana had no rate changes.

### Unaccounted-for Water Loss

Commission regulation 807 KAR 5:066, Section 6(3), states that for ratemaking purposes a utility's unaccounted-for water loss shall not exceed 15 percent of the total water produced and purchased, excluding water consumed by a utility in its own operations. In its 2022 Annual Report filed with the Commission, Harrison Water reported a water loss of 20.8656 percent.<sup>3</sup> In its 2023 Annual Report filed with the Commission, Harrison Water reported a water loss of 19.9417 percent.<sup>4</sup> In its 2024 Annual Report filed

with the Commission, Harrison Water reported a water loss of 26.1334 percent.<sup>5</sup> Harrison Water's three-year water loss average is 22.3136 percent.<sup>6</sup> The cost of Harrison Water's total water loss using a three-year average is \$514,699.04.<sup>7</sup>

In Harrison Water's recent rate case,<sup>8</sup> the Commission approved a monthly water loss reduction surcharge of \$1.43 per customer for 48 months to help lower system losses to more acceptable levels.<sup>9</sup> On January 11, 2024, Case No. 2023-00355 was established in order for the Commission to monitor the progress of the water loss reduction surcharge plan established for Harrison Water.<sup>10</sup>

### Financial Condition and Rates

Harrison Water's financial snapshot for 2020 through 2024 is presented below. Based on a review of Commission records, Harrison Water last sought a general base rate adjustment in 2023,<sup>11</sup> in Case No. 2023-00154 (2022 test year), which became final on January 11, 2024, and reflected an increase of \$184,194 or 5.82 percent. Substantially all of the increase was realized during 2024. Harrison Water's other rate increases during the review period were due to purchased water adjustment cases. The revenue increase

was more than offset by a 6.2 percentage point increase in water loss. Staff also notes that approximately \$300,000 in rate making adjustments were made in Case No. 2023-00154 that reduced the revenue requirement. The impact of the adjustments contributed to the Rate Based Loss in 2024.

In Case No. 2019-00041, the Commission discussed the problems that can occur when utilities intentionally avoid a review of its financial records by relying solely on financing cases to increase rates.<sup>12</sup> A key recommendation from that proceeding was that water associations should monitor the sufficiency of their base rates closely and, in general, apply for base rate adjustments on a more frequent basis.<sup>13</sup>

Given this information, the Commission finds that Harrison Water should continue to monitor its operating performance annually to determine whether a rate adjustment application should be submitted. Future rate cases should be filed every three to five years depending on financial performance.

### Purchased Water Adjustment Factor

In its application, Harrison Water proposed a purchased water adjustment factor of \$0.0009132 per gallon.<sup>14</sup> During the 12 months ended December 31, 2025, Harrison Water purchased 437,146,780 gallons of water from Cynthiana, 29,030,600 gallons of water from Kentucky-American at intake 353 Centerville, 17,288,260 gallons of water from Kentucky-American at intake U.S. 60, 39,601,900 gallons of water from Kentucky-American at Millersburg and zero gallons of water from Nicholas District.<sup>15</sup> Harrison Water sold 381,849,000 gallons of water to its customers.<sup>16</sup> The increase in the cost of purchased water from Kentucky-American is \$348,691.67, resulting in a purchased water adjustment factor of \$0.9132 per 1,000 gallons. No rate changes occurred from Cynthiana or Nicholas District.

The purchased water adjustment factor of \$0.9132 per 1,000 gallons, as calculated in Appendix A and the rates as set forth in Appendix B to this Order are fair, just and reasonable and should be approved for water service rendered by Harrison Water on and after January 13, 2026, because the rates are supported by evidence of the increase in rates from Harrison Water's wholesale water supplier and the volume of purchased water used to calculate the rates in accordance with KRS 278.012.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED that:

1. The purchased water adjustment factor of \$0.9132 per 1,000 gallons is approved.

2. The rates proposed by Harrison Water are approved.
3. The rates as set forth in Appendix B to this Order are approved for water service rendered by Harrison Water on and after January 13, 2026.
4. Within 20 days of the date of service of this Order, Harrison Water shall file with the Commission, using the Commission's electronic Tariff Filing System, revised tariff sheets showing the rates approved herein.
5. This case is closed and removed from the Commission's docket.
