ORDER

The Commission, pursuant to 807 KAR 5:056, Section 3(3), hereby initiates three 6-month reviews concurrently to examine the application of the Fuel Adjustment Clause (FAC) from November 1, 2024, through April 30, 2026 of Big Sandy Rural Electric Cooperative Corporation; Blue Grass Energy Cooperative Corporation; Clark Energy Cooperative, Inc.; Cumberland Valley Electric, Inc.; Famers Rural Electric Cooperative Corporation; Fleming-Mason Energy Cooperative, Inc.; Grayson Rural Electric Cooperative Corporation; Inter-County Energy Cooperative Corporation; Jackson Energy Cooperative Corporation; Licking Valley Rural Electric Cooperative Corporation; Nolin Rural Electric Cooperative Corporation; Owen Electric Cooperative, Inc.; Salt River Electric Cooperative Corporation; Shelby Energy Cooperative, Inc.; South Kentucky Rural Electric Cooperative Corporation; and Taylor County Rural Electric Cooperative Corporation (collectively, Cooperatives or individually Cooperative).

Pursuant to 807 KAR 5:056, Section 3(3), the Commission shall conduct a formal review at 6-month intervals on utility's past fuel adjustments. For the purpose of

administrative efficiency, the Commission finds that this proceeding will include the separate 6-month FAC review periods of: November 1, 2024, through April 30, 2025; May 1, 2025, through October 31, 2025; and November 1, 2025, through April 30, 2026.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED that:

1. The Commission initiates three 6-month reviews concurrently to examine the Cooperatives' application of their FAC from November 1, 2024, through April 30, 2025; May 1, 2025, through October 31, 2025; and November 1, 2025, through April 30, 2026.

2. Each Cooperative shall individually file with the Commission, on or before December 2, 2026, an affidavit attesting to its compliance or noncompliance with the requirements of 807 KAR 5:056 for the entire review period of November 1, 2024, through April 30, 2026.

3. Any party filing a paper with the Commission shall file an electronic copy in accordance with the electronic filing procedures set forth in 807 KAR 5:001, Section 8. Electronic documents shall be in portable document format (PDF), shall be searchable, and shall be appropriately bookmarked. The Commission directs the Cooperatives to the Commission's July 22, 2021 Order in Case No. 2020-00085¹ regarding filings with the Commission.

4. All documents that each Cooperative filed with the Commission during the three 6-month periods under review pursuant to 807 KAR 5:056, Section 2(1)–(4), are incorporated by reference into the record of this proceeding.

5. The Cooperatives shall respond to all requests for information propounded by Commission Staff as provided in those requests.

6. As set forth in 807 KAR 5:001, Section 4(11)(a), a person requesting permissive intervention in a Commission proceeding is required to demonstrate either (1) a special interest in the proceedings that is not adequately represented in the case, or (2) that intervention is likely to present issues or develop facts that will assist the Commission in fully considering the matter without unduly complicating or disrupting the proceedings. Therefore, any person requesting to intervene in a Commission proceeding must state with specificity the person's special interest that is not otherwise adequately represented, or the issues and facts that the person will present that will assist the Commission in fully considering the matter. A mere recitation of the quantity of utility service consumed by the movant or a general statement regarding a potential impact of possible modification of rates will not be deemed sufficient to establish a special interest.

7. Any request for intervention must be filed by November 13, 2026.

8. Any motion to intervene filed after November 13, 2026, shall also show good cause for being untimely. If the untimely motion is granted, the movant shall accept and abide by the existing procedural schedule.

9. Pursuant to 807 KAR 5:001, Section 8, unless a party granted leave to intervene states its objection to the use of electronic filing procedures in a motion for intervention, the party shall be deemed to have consented to the use of electronic filing procedures and the service of all papers, including orders of the Commission, by electronic means; the party shall file with the Commission, within seven days of the date of service of an order of the Commission granting the intervention, a written statement

that the party waives any right to service of Commission orders by United States mail; and the party, or the party's authorized agent, possesses the facilities to receive electronic transmissions.

10. Witnesses who sponsor schedules, testimony, or responses to requests for information shall participate in person at any hearing scheduled in this matter.

11. The Commission does not look favorably upon motions for continuance. Accordingly, motions for extensions of time with respect to the schedule herein shall be made in writing and will be granted only upon a showing of good cause..

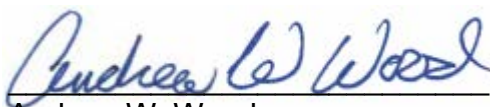

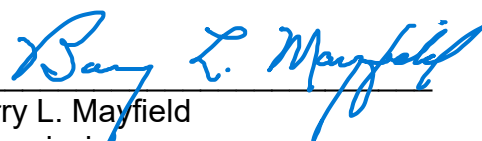
