ORDER

On February 17, 1981, the Energy Regulatory Commission received a letter from the Jellico Electric System which sought approval from the Energy Regulatory Commission to utilize the Frankfort Meter and Electric Company for testing of its meters.

The Public Service Commission, having superseded the Energy Regulatory Commission, after considering the request and being advised is of the opinion and finds:

- 1. That in accordance with 807 KAR 50:015, Section 13, Paragraph 2, a utility may have all or part of its testing of meters performed by another utility or agency which has been approved by the Commission for this purpose.
- 2. That the proposed testing arrangement is in the public interest and should be approved.

The Public Service Commission further finds that the approval of the proposed arrangement does not relieve the utility from the responsibility of insuring that all tests of meters and measuring devices are performed in accordance with the requirements of the Rules and Regulations of the Commission.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED that Jellico Electric System be and it is hereby granted approval to utilize the services of Frankfort Meter and Electric Company for the testing of its meters.
