ORDER

IT IS ORDERED that Boston Water District shall file an original and seven copies of the following information with the Commission with a copy to all parties of record by October 31, 1983. If neither the requested information nor a motion for an extension of time is filed by the stated date, the case may be dismissed.

1. Provide a billing analysis showing revenue from present rate structure by customer class. This billing analysis should cover the same period as the billing analysis furnished for proposed rates.

2. Billing analysis for Class B 3/4 inch meter shows a total gallons of 1,467,100. When broken down into the rate steps there is a total of 1,872,100, a difference of 405,000 gallons. Provide an explanation for this discrepancy and a corrected billing analysis for Class B.

3. Your 1982 Annual Report line 14, page 10 shows 51,441,000 gallons sold to residential, commercial and

industrial customers. Your application shows 42,685,300 or 43,090,300 (see question 2). Please explain this discrepancy.


4. What is your present cost of water per 1,000 gallons.

5. Why do you propose to change your rate design by combining the Class B and C customers? How will this benefit the utility and the customers.

6. Page 3 of your application shows a percentage increase of 79.26 percent. How did you arrive at this figure?
