The Commission, having considered the Motions and being advised, finds that to allow official intervention status for each and every user who requests it will be unduly costly to the utility and will not substantially add to the evidence of record. The Attorney General's Office is available to provide such representation and has agreed to do so in this case. Also, another group of residents, South Shelby Civic Association, Inc., filed a petition to intervene and, being represented by its president, will be allowed full intervention status. The Commission encourages these residents to either join the original petition or use the Attorney General's Office as their representative in this case.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED that the Motions for Intervention listed in the body of this Order be and they hereby are denied. They will be treated as official protests and placed in the official case record.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the Secretary of the Commission shall notify these petitioners as to the procedures to contact both the Attorney General and other parties who may be of specific help to these consumers.
