<p>D-1 Average Database Update Interval / The impact is estimated to be an increase of less than one hour for this measure</p>	<p>On the regional aggregated report, the number of updates during the reporting period is currently being overstated and should be a distinct count of the number of updates and not a count of the number of updates per state as this is a regional report. For example if AL, FL, GA, and TN each had an update on the same day, this would be 1 update, not 4. The denominator of the average interval should never exceed 31.</p>
<p>P-7A Coordinated Customer Conversions - hot Cut Timeliness % Within Interval and Average Interval / The impact to approximately 2.75% of the orders occurs when a BellSouth Technician occasionally uses the letter O instead of the number 0 when coding a jeopardy in the measure.</p>	<p>Occasionally, A BellSouth technician uses a letter "O" instead of the number "0" when closing an order to a jeopardy code. Analysis of October data showed that this occurred approximately 2.75% of the time.</p>
<p>P-7A Coordinated Customer Conversions - hot Cut Timeliness % Within Interval and Average Interval / Analysis indicates for the disaggregations stated in in the Florida SQM, all orders still met the benchmark stated so there is no impact to the result of the measure.</p>	<p>In the Florida permanent measures, a discrepancy was found between the SQM and the MSS. The denominator determination for these disaggregation of counts of IDLC for SL1 and SL2 orders showed a difference between the reports. BellSouth proposes to reconcile the differences.</p>
