In December 2006, Elizabethtown Water Company and Mount Holly Water Company, both New Jersey Utilities, were merged into New Jersey American Water Company. This merger added approximately 225,000 customers to New Jersey American Water Company's customer base. Impacts of this increase in NJA's customer base to Kentucky American Water Company will be reflected through the provisions of the approved contract between Kentucky American Water Company and American Water Works Service Company, which provides for allocation of common costs among all water companies receiving services from the Service Company based on the number of customers served by each company. Any other synergies resulting from said merger are specific to New Jersey.
