RESOLUTION NO: 2003- 7

A RESOLUTION OF THE CLARK COUNTY FISCAL COURT
URGING LOCAL MANAGEMENT OF SOLID WASTE ISSUES RELATED TO
THE KENTUCKY PIONEER ENERGY PLANT

WHEREAS, the Clark County Fiscal Court, affirms that the Resource Conservation and Recovery Act of 1976, recognizes that the management of solid waste should continue to be primarily the function of the state, regional, and local agencies, and

WHEREAS, the proposed Kentucky Power Pioneer Energy Plant consumes pelletized solid waste that could severely impact the environment and economy of Clark County citizens, and

WHEREAS, the Clark County Fiscal Court will be the governmental unit primarily responsible for the management, acquisition, financing, and operation of facilities to deal with the solid waste issues that may arise as a result of the implementation of the proposed plant facility,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Clark County Fiscal Court of Kentucky in duly session assembled as follows:

SECTION ONE. That the Clark County Fiscal Court asserts to the Public Service Commission that the ultimate determination regarding the appropriateness of the Kentucky Pioneer Energy Plant proposed for Trapp, Kentucky, rests with local government. The Clark County Fiscal Court implores the Public Service Commission to take the necessary action to assure the sanctity of the rights of the citizens of Clark County to manage those environmental concerns that arise in their own county and to govern their community in accordance with law and as permitted by the Kentucky Constitution. To do otherwise would constitute an unfunded mandate.


